The program can be completed in five years for those able to commit themselves to full-time study and work at the Institute. Individuals with significant outside obligations are nonetheless encouraged to apply, and are expected to take additional years to complete the program. **Regardless of other obligations or enrollment status, all students are required to satisfy the residency requirement of full-time enrollment in the Psy.D. program for at least one academic year prior to beginning the pre-doctoral internship.**

**Course Descriptions - *The course description for PSY 504 has been changed to:***

**PSY 504 – Psychological Measurement (3 credit hours)**

**This course covers psychometric theory and techniques designed for assessing and researching human characteristics. To understand the study and measurement of psychological phenomena, students will be required to understand statistics and related graphical and other computational tools necessary for psychological measurement. The first part of the course provides fundamentals of psychological assessment and measurements and appropriate statistical analysis. Building on these fundamentals, the second part of the course examines psychometric theory, concepts and computational methods for use in the practice of psychology.**
