Development of the Person Scale:

This is an original index for the assessment of interpersonal behavior. The initial pilot study includes the administration of the Person Scale along with four other scales for validation purposes and additional administrations for reliability studies. Data collection began September, 2007 at IPS and will continue at the DC Department of Mental Health. In a second phase of the research, a revised scale will be placed on the web and participants are likely to be obtained from the North East, the Middle Atlantic Region and California, to start with.

A Prospective Study of Early Indicators of Dementia Pugilistic: Results From the First Trial

The study has been sanctioned by the Maryland State Boxing Commission and dialogue is taking place with the D.C. Boxing Commission (This is the first longitudinal study of dementia pugilistica ever done. It is currently in progress and the team has enrolled and assessed over 200 boxers during preflight medical examinations and the sample is growing. We have also begun the second trial, 12 month follow-up assessments Follow-up is planned over a five to ten year period.
